Dear Friends and Family,

Christmas 2017 is almost here so I had better get busy and get a letter done.

A major change in my life is that I completed my second terms as Clerk of the Presbytery. Presbytery Standing Orders limit a clerk to two terms so there was no decision to be made. I miss the contacts.

In early June I found myself in Taiwan. It was a wonderful trip. It was at the invitation of the Bunun Presbytery. Susan Clarke, minister in Elora and I were invited to the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Bunun Presbytery. I was able to see a few of the people that I knew when I worked in Taiwan. I regret there were several I did not see but so thankful that I was able to talk briefly on the phone with both Dr. and Mrs. Kao.

The big event in my life was the celebration of my 80<sup>th</sup> birthday on July 9<sup>th</sup>. About 120 people came to an event to celebrate with me. I am adding a picture on the email copy of this letter. My Aunt Nicki, Uncle Donald and Maria, and cousins (adopted sisters) honoured me in planning this event – Carole Ann Hattle, Susan Roszel, Linda Foley, Brenda Collins, and Sheri Mainprize.
